The Denver Museum of Nature & Science completed the largest-ever fossil excavation project at Ziegler Reservoir near Snowmass Village in 2011 where more than 5,400 bones were discovered during a seven week period. The site is a complex series of Ice Age ecosystems that has already yielded the largest collection of Mastodon bones from a single site anywhere. Initial radiocarbon dating indicates the site is more than 45,000 years old, and geologists estimate it could be as old as 130,000 to 150,000 years. It is likely the best high elevation Ice Age site anywhere in the world. Twenty six vertebrate animals have been identified, and the number of species will grow as work continues at the museum.

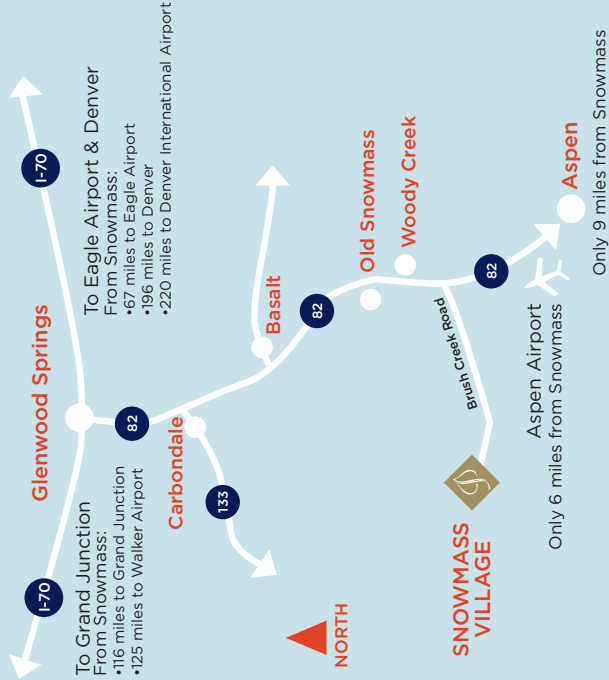
