

Snowmass 101

- Free buses to Aspen depart every 30 minutes from the Snowmass Mall, Base Village Transit Center and Town Park Station between 6:45am and 1:45am. Schedules and information at rfta.com
- Free Village Shuttles run 8 routes serving Snowmass lodges and main destinations every 20 minutes. Schedules and information at snowmasstransit.com.
- 37 restaurants and 40 shops in Snowmass Village offer everything from schnitzel to ski suits, in spaces from casual to cozy to chic. Over 20 restaurants serve children's menus.
- One lift ticket grants access to all four Aspen Snowmass mountains: Snowmass, Aspen Mountain, Aspen Highlands and Buttermilk.
- Two main dining and shopping areas Base Village and the Snowmass Mall - are connected by a free Sky Cab Gondola, affectionately called The Skittles.
- Clark's Market, Snowmass' main grocery store and pharmacy, is located at the Snowmass Center on Brush Creek Road and is open 7:00am-10:00pm daily.
- Information centers at Town Park, Base Village and the Snowmass Mall provide event schedules, activities information and directions.

Did you know that mammoths, mastodons and giant ground sloths used to roam these lands?

In October 2010, a bulldozer operator working near Snowmass Village unearthed a single tusk of a young female mammoth. Over the next ten months, the Denver Museum of Nature and Science stepped in and uncovered more than 5,000 bones of prehistoric animals – 41 species in all. The Snowmass site quickly became the richest Ice Age ecosystem yet to be found at such high altitude.

Visit the Ice Age Discovery Center on the Snowmass Mall to learn the amazing story behind the discovery. The exhibit is fun for both kids and adults, with interactive displays, a resident paleontologist, and plenty of fossilized bones and teeth.




