Snowmass is the New Mountain Biking Heart of Gold, IMBA Gold

Aspen Snowmass / Roaring Fork IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center

In January 2020, Snowmass, along with the rest of the Roaring Fork Valley was designated as the first IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center™ in Colorado by the International Mountain Biking Association. The IMBA Gold-Level designation, the top award for mountain biking destinations, offers mountain bike enthusiasts more than 300 miles of high quality singletrack from Aspen and Snowmass to Basalt, Carbondale, and Glenwood Springs. Guests riding in Snowmass and the Roaring Fork Valley can take their pick of adventure, from lift-served gravity trails in the Snowmass Bike Park and expert-only long rides, to family-friendly trails and backcountry adventures. The Aspen Snowmass / Roaring Fork IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center is the first Gold-Level Ride Center in Colorado, only the fifth in United States, and among seven in the world. https://bike.gosnowmass.com/imba-gold-ride-center/

Additional News

Snowmass Bike Park Expansion

The Snowmass Bike Park continues its multi-year expansion project with construction beginning on three more trails this summer, in collaboration with Gravity Logic, worldrenowned trail builders. This summer's trail build-out brings the Snowmass Bike Park to over 25 miles of bike terrain across 14 trails containing a mix of beginner to expert flow and hybrid trails. The new trails add close to three and a half miles of additional freeride bike terrain. Two of the new trails will be rated as most difficult while the third will be labeled as more difficult. Snowmass Bike Park also added three miles of new bike trails last summer. The first of those new trails, Gonzo, an experts-only freeride trail, extends .8 miles along bikers right of Valhalla and hosts the largest features in the bike park. The next trail, Valkyrie, covers close to a mile of terrain to bikers left of Valhalla and is classified as a more difficult freeride trail. The third trail, called Battle Axe, extends off Viking for a mile and is ranked as a more difficult single-track trail. Lastly, Gargamel, a more difficult technical trail begins halfway down the mountain off Verde and runs for a half-of-a-mile. Spanning from the top of the Elk Camp chairlift to the bottom of Snowmass Base Village, the trail system currently offers 2,893 ft. of vertical descent that features over 22 miles of purpose-built gravity trails.

Maroon Bells Access

New this year, reservations are required to access the Maroon Bells scenic area by vehicle or RFTA (Roaring Fork Transportation Authority) bus. The reservation system provides efficient visitor transportation while protecting the scenic area and following guidelines to stay in-line with social distancing requirements. Limited automobile access is available with a reservation, which is required for parking at the Maroon Lake, West Maroon or East Maroon lots. Parking fees are \$10 per vehicle. Starting June 28, visitors are required to use the RFTA shuttle service between the hours of 8:00am to 5:00pm. When buses are not in operation, vehicles may access the parking areas with a reservation. The

bus fare costs \$15.95 for all reservations. All vehicle and shuttle reservations must be obtained in advance from www.aspenchamber.org.

Care for Colorado Principles

In a first of its kind partnership, Snowmass Village has joined with the Colorado Tourism Office and the Leave No Trace Center for Outdoor Ethics to create the Care for Colorado Principles to educate both visitors and residents about traveling the state responsibly. Visitors can learn about Care for Colorado in the CTO's "Are You Colo-Ready?" brochures, animated videos, as well as through CTO publications, in the 10 Colorado Welcome Centers, as well as at the Snowmass Village Guest Services Centers. The Principles aim to inspire low-impact travel, from the care of trails and mindful interaction with wildlife to the use of refillable beverage containers.
