SNOWMASS

- Take a stroll around the new Snowmass Base Village! The new **Limelight Hotel & Residences**, skating rink and plaza are officially open as of December 15, with more residences and commercial spaces still in development.
- Snowmass' two slopeside dining and shopping areas – Snowmass Base Village and the Snowmass Mall – are connected by a free Sky Cab Gondola, affectionately called the Skittles.
- Use the free Village Shuttle system to get around Snowmass, departing Daly Lane and points around the Village every 20 minutes. Find schedules and information at SnowmassTransit.com.
- Want to pop into Aspen? Free RFTA buses to Aspen depart every 30 minutes from the Snowmass Mall, Base Village Transit Center and Town Park Station between 6:45am and 1:45am. Find schedules and information at RFTA.com.
- Clark's Market, Snowmass' main grocery store and pharmacy, is located at the Snowmass Center on Brush Creek Road and is open 7:00am-10:00pm daily.
- Information centers at Town Park Station and the Snowmass Mall provide event schedules, activities information and directions. Stop by 9:00am-5:00pm daily, or call 970.922.2233.
- Take a ride on the Breathtaker Alpine Coaster, open year-round at the top of the Elk Camp Gondola. It's part of the new Lost Forest adventure center that includes zip lines, ropes courses and more that are open in the summer.
- There is nothing quite like a powder day at Snowmass, and when it snows 8" or more overnight, the Ullrhof serves up free pancakes 10:00-11:00am. Check the snow report to find out if it's a **Powder Pancake day!**

ICE AGE DISCOVERY CENTER * 📣

Did you know that mammoths, mastodons and giant ground sloths used to roam these lands? In October 2010, a bulldozer operator working near Snowmass Village unearthed a single tusk of a young female mammoth. Over the next ten months, the Denver Museum of Nature and Science uncovered more than 5,000 bones of prehistoric animals – 41 species in all. The Snowmass site quickly became the richest Ice Age ecosystem yet to be found at such high altitude.

Visit the Ice Age Discovery Center on the Snowmass Mall to learn the amazing story behind the discovery. The exhibit is fun for both kids and adults, with interactive displays, and plenty of fossilized bones and teeth.




