Options Include Guided Hikes, Events, Activities, and the Snowmass Ice Age Discovery

Snowmass Village, Colo., (Summer 2025) – Snowmass Village, CO is renowned as a world-class destination, home to luxury hotels, upscale dining, boutique shopping, and one-of-a-kind experiences. Yet beyond the high-end appeal, Snowmass also boasts a robust lineup of free summer activities, events, and adventures for both visitors and the local community to enjoy.

Free Activities in Snowmass

ACES Guided Hikes – Daily, June 14 – September 1; Weekends only in September: Aspen Center for Environmental Studies (ACES) returns to Snowmass this summer to lead twice daily hikes. The Snowmass Wildflower Walk begins at 10:00am, on the Nature Trail, while the Ice Age Discovery Walk starts at 1:00pm on the Discovery Trail. Hikes are led by a knowledgeable ACES Naturalist guide and feature natural history, facts about local flora and fauna, possible wildlife sightings, and species identification. Hikes depart from the Snowmass Mall Ticket Pavilion. Saturdays and Sundays only in September: September 6-7, September 13-14, September 20-21, September 27-28. www.gosnowmass.com/activity/aces/

Anderson Ranch Arts Center: Founded in 1966, Anderson Ranch Arts Center is a premier destination for art making and critical dialog in the contemporary art world, bringing together aspiring and internationally renowned artists to discuss and further their work in a stimulating environment. With a campus that is free and open to the public and an extensive array of in-person and online offerings, Anderson Ranch is a hub of creative energy and activity for adults and children alike, with a host of virtual and interactive art workshops, lectures by today's most influential artists and curators, weekend classes, children's art workshops and more. www.andersonranch.org

Aspen Snowmass / Roaring Fork IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center: Snowmass, along with the rest of the Roaring Fork Valley is the first IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center™ in Colorado, as designated by the International Mountain Biking Association. The IMBA Gold-Level designation, the top award for mountain biking destinations, offers mountain bike enthusiasts more than 300 miles of high quality singletrack from Aspen and Snowmass to Basalt, Carbondale, and Glenwood Springs. Guests riding in Snowmass and the Roaring Fork Valley can take their pick of adventure, from lift-served gravity trails in the Snowmass Bike Park and expert-only long rides, to family-friendly trails and backcountry adventures. The Aspen Snowmass / Roaring Fork IMBA Gold-Level Ride Center is the first Gold-Level Ride Center in Colorado, only the fifth in United States, and among only seven in the world. Rides vary for all age and skill levels. www.bikesnowmass.com

Hiking: Snowmass has 90+ miles of hiking trails, and 2.8 million acres of adjacent wilderness to be explored, providing accessible and scenic hiking for all abilities. Visit www.hikesnowmass.com to plan a curated hike for any ability.

Snowmass Ice Age Discovery: In 2010, a construction crew unearthed a single tusk of a mammoth while digging at Ziegler Reservoir in Snowmass Village. The Denver Museum of Nature and Science took over the site and went on to unearth 35,000 bones of large mammals and small vertebrate species. The Snowmass paleontological site is the richest Ice Age ecosystem ever found at high altitude. Explore a dedicated Ice Age Discovery website, complete with video and augmented reality experiences; artful exhibits on designated trails and around Snowmass; an Ice Age passport experience through the Village; and more. www.snowmassiceage.com

Ice Age Explorer Tours – Fridays, June 13 – September 26: Did you know Snowmass is the site of the finest ice age fossil discovery in the world? Learn the full story of this remarkable discovery from an Aspen Science Center educator. Every Friday at 3:30pm, meet in the Limelight Snowmass lobby to learn about the mammoths and mastodons who used to live in Snowmass, and see replicas of Ice Age animal bones, teeth, tusks, and more. Then, follow along on a guided Ice Age Passport Walk through Base Village and the Snowmass Mall to see art inspired by the discovery and earn an Ice Age prize! The Collective Snowmass – Daily, June-September: The Collective Snowmass, the hub for culture and community activity in Snowmass Base Village, has a jam-packed calendar for Summer 2025! Returning favorites include Community Bingo, Chess Club, Fitness on the Rink, Movies Under the Stars, and the Snowmass Live Comedy Series. Check the calendar for unique events like salsa dancing lessons, relaxing wellness workshops, ecstatic dance sessions, and many other pop-up activities. The Collective also features yard games, splash pads, fountains, and playground throughout Snowmass Base Village. The Game Lounge and Selfie Den are open Tuesday-Sunday, 2:00pm-8:00pm; free for children 5 and under, \$10 for everyone 6 and over. Always ask about the locals rate at the Game Lounge! Transportation: The Roaring Fork Transit Authority (RFTA) provides extensive free bus service from Snowmass to Aspen and various points throughout the valley (for a nominal fee). Snowmass also has a free local shuttle service (Snowmass Village Shuttles) to all major activity areas in Snowmass Village. Shuttles depart every 10 minutes from the shuttle terminal located just below the Snowmass Mall on Daly Lane. Most lodging properties in Snowmass offer free shuttle service to and from the airport and around Snowmass Village. www.gosnowmass.com/about-us/maps-travel/transportation/

WE-cycle: The Roaring Fork Valley's not for profit free bikeshare program, WE-cycle, offers a quick and fast bike connection between the 11 stations around the village, all served by WE-cycle e-bikes. Snowmass joins Aspen, Basalt, Willits, El Jebel, and Carbondale in offering this fare-free service to provide a convenient and healthy form of transportation. A beloved Snowmass tradition, the 50th Anniversary event features three days of hot air balloon beauty at Snowmass Town Park. Friday features a Night Glow under the stars, where guests can walk among tethered balloons, while enjoying music and concessions. The iconic morning launches begin at sunrise on Saturday and Sunday and this 50th anniversary event features more balloons than ever before – 40 in total, making the Snowmass event the biggest mountain balloon festival in the state. The festival atmosphere includes Bloody Mary and Mimosa bars and breakfast vendors rounding out the fun.
