Snowmass Off the Slopes

Snowmass offers plenty of off the slopes fun for those non-skiing days.

Snowmass Village, Colo., (Winter 2025/2026) – Snowmass Village is famous for its unparalleled skiing and snowboarding terrain, offering guests over 3,340 acres to explore. However, Snowmass also offers a wide variety of activities and adventures for those days spent off the slopes, or for non-skiers to enjoy.

Outdoor Activities

Blazing Adventures: With over 50 years of experience specializing in outdoor activities in Colorado, [Blazing Adventures](#) coordinates winter activities such as hot balloon rides, backcountry powder tours, scenic drive tours, winter fly-fishing in Gold Medal rivers, snowmobiling up to the Maroon Bells, backcountry snowshoe tours, and much more.

Cross Country Skiing: Glide across snowy meadows and through silent pine forests and aspen groves on over 60 miles of groomed, all-level [Nordic trails](#). Part of the

Aspen Snowmass trail system, the largest free trail system in the US, trails can be accessed from the Snowmass Golf Course. Trail access is free; bring your own gear.

Elk Camp: 15 minutes up the mountain from Snowmass Base Village by scenic gondola, is [Elk Camp](#). Guests can grab a bite to eat at the Elk Camp Restaurant, enjoy rides on the Breathtaker Coaster and take a spin on the tubing hill.

Fat Biking: Fat bike lovers, rejoice! Snowmass is home to approximately 8 miles of groomed trails, good for fat biking. Bring your own [fat bike](#) and park for free at the Snowmass Rec Center to ride the trails in Snowmass. Groomed (and paved) trails include Owl Creek, Brush Creek, Fairway, Village Way, Fox Run, and Melton Ranch.

Game of Stones: Curling returns to Snowmass with the ever-popular [Game of Stones](#) curling series on The Rink in Snowmass Base Village. On select dates December through March, teams of two compete in a head-to-head elimination competition. The first team to reach 10 points wins! Game of Stones takes place from 3:00pm to 5:00pm; register on site. Weather dependent.

Ice Skating: Want to practice a hockey stop, perfect that pirouette, or simply glide around for an evening skate? Snowmass offers two free ice skating rinks. One at [The Rink](#) in Snowmass Base Village (free rentals included) and the other, [Snowmass Village Ice Rink](#), at the Snowmass Recreation Center (BYO skates), located on the tennis courts for the winter season. Both operate during the winter season, weather permitting.

Snowmass Ice Age Discovery: Snowmass is the site of the largest ice age fossil discovery in the world. More than 150,000 years ago, glaciers covered the area that would become Snowmass Village. In 2010, a bulldozer operator working in Snowmass unearthed the fossilized remains of a young Columbian mammoth. Soon after, scientists uncovered an entire fossilized ecosystem. To celebrate this incredible discovery, Snowmass has installed various art installations around the Village. Want to dig deeper? Attend an Ice Age Explorer Tour lead by an Aspen Science Center educator to view the art and informational exhibits around the Village. Tours take place every Tuesday at 2:00pm beginning in the Limelight Snowmass. Visit www.snowmassiceage.com for everything else there is to see and know about this incredible find.

Snowshoeing & Uphilling: Take a two-hour, [guided snowshoe tour](#) with an ACES naturalist, starting at the top of the Elk Camp Gondola, daily at 10:00am and 1:00pm.

Snowshoers can also visit the Snowmass Golf Course for a trek on the Snowmass cross country trails. Snowshoers can explore Snowmass Ski Area on a wide variety of uphill trails. An Uphill Pass for on-resort uphill access is required. Uphillers need to remain on designated, signed routes during all operating hours. Uphillers should check the Aspen Snowmass App or [website](#) before heading out to see if the selected route is open.

Ullr Nights: In honor of the Norse God of Snow, Ullr, [Ullr Nights](#) return to Snowmass this winter. Take an evening gondola ride up the Elk Camp Gondola to the Elk Camp Restaurant for winter themed fun, including tubing, rides on the Breathtaker Alpine Coaster, a bonfire, s'mores, and hot cocoa. Enjoy an à la carte culinary celebration from 5:00pm to 7:30pm on select nights throughout the season.

Indoor Activities

105 Pizza & Bowl: 105 Pizza & Bowl offers [nightly bowling](#) on six lanes, as well as lounge games such as foosball, billiards, and darts. 105 also features a full kitchen and bar.

Anderson Ranch Arts Center: Founded in 1966, [Anderson Ranch Arts Center](#) is a premier destination for art making and critical dialog in the contemporary art world, bringing together aspiring and internationally renowned artists to discuss and further their work in a stimulating environment. With a campus that is free and open to the public and an extensive array of in-person and online offerings, Anderson Ranch is a hub of creative energy and activity for adults and children alike, with a host of virtual and interactive art workshops, lectures by today's most influential artists and curators, weekend classes, children's art workshops and more.

Rock Climbing: The Limelight Hotel Snowmass is home to the tallest [indoor climbing wall](#) in Colorado. At five stories and 54-foot-tall, the wall features three lanes for simultaneous climbing offers fun for beginners and experts alike. Climbing shoes and harness, as well as guided supervision, are included with each 30-minute session. Visitors to the [Snowmass Recreation Center](#) can also enjoy self-belayed climbing and a bouldering cave.

Spa Time: [Viewline Spa by RAKxa](#) at Viewline Resort Snowmass offers a seamless transition from the exhilaration of the slopes to the calm of alpine wellness. Rooted in RAKxa's holistic approach to healing with Spa Director Amelia Winfrey at the helm, the spa offers expert massages, facials, and body treatments that restore both body and mind. The luxurious 7,000-square-foot [Spa at the Viceroy Snowmass](#) offers

selection of holistic wellness experiences, from Ute Indian-inspired therapies to contemporary beauty rituals. [Alux Spalon](#) in Snowmass Base Village and on the Snowmass Mall offers treatments for hair, nails, facials, and waxing.

Snowmass Recreation Center: The 18,000-square-foot [recreation facility](#) offers unique programming for adults and children, year-round outdoor saline pools, a state-of-the-art cardio and weight room, an indoor gymnasium, aerobics classes, climbing & bouldering walls, and more.
