Did you know that Snowmass is the site of the largest ice age fossil discovery in the world? More than 150,000 years ago, glaciers covered the area that would become Snowmass Village. In 2010, a bulldozer operator working in Snowmass unearthed the fossilized remains of a young Columbian mammoth! Soon after, scientists uncovered an entire fossilized ecosystem.
