Roaring Forge, LLC (Ken Reiley, John Hofman and Joe Burleigh)

Medium: Mixed Metals

"Metamorphosis" honors the restoration of Brush Creek and the return of its Mayfly population. In 1999, Roaring Forge LLC was commissioned to mark the creek's transformation with a Mayfly caught in its own metamorphosis — Eggs and Nymph placed on creekside boulders, and a winged Adult perched atop giant 10-foot grass blades forged from angle iron. The blades were painted green, the Mayfly given a brown patina, and its stainless-steel wings left bright and mounted on a spring so they flutter in the breeze. The adjacent nature path was so inspired by the installation its designers named it the "Mayfly Trail." We later learned Mayflies aren't typically found at this altitude. Well, they are now.

Lady with Diamonds depicts a woman's profile facing the wind, her diamond-shaped wings symbolizing intellect and clarity. Perched atop a giant stone, she soars in mind and spirit through every season.

From the artist: This sculpture is about the woman I love — and my belief that art must have personal meaning to have a soul. The diamond wings represent clear, elevated thinking. I see it as a drawing in three dimensions. Be still, look, and breathe it in. Art will always tell you the truth.

This memorial honors two fallen firefighters, installed by the fire chief. When the new fire station was built, the two memorial trees that had been planted in their honor couldn't survive being relocated – so this sculpture took their place. The base is carved from Yule Marble, quarried in Marble, Colorado.


